Faith Formation:

As a school community, we begin each day with Morning Prayers and Gospel readings.

- *Our Grade 2 and Grade 7 students prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation. Communion and Confirmation.

- *Staff are encouraged to attend Faith retreats and PD sessions such as the Advent Retreat and When Faith Meets Pedagogy Conference.
- *Rosary Apostolate We are blessed to have volunteers come to the school once a month, to lead our students and staff in prayer.
- *Adult Faith Formation opportunities: Staff and community are encouraged to attend daily morning mass at Our Lady of the Airways Church Parish
- *Eucharistic Ministers: Staff members will be offered information to become Eucharistic Ministers by Enza Lamberti Pastoral Associate at Our Lady of the Airways.

Sacramental Preparation:

Social Justice / Outreach Activities / Charities:

Catholic Social Teachings of the Church root our actions in supporting human dignity and the preferential option of the poor which calls us to serve the most vulnerable in the world.

Holy Cross participates in several activities that support members of our school, our community and the world:

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

All our school programs, outreach initiatives, and classroom lessons foster the development of a Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations. In our morning announcements regularly we include a description of individual expectations and how we can strive to achieve the expectations. Here at Holy Cross we will make a concerted effort to include an overview of the Expectations as well as a detailed individual description of an expectation in our School Newsletter.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

The virtues and the OCSGE are celebrated each day when we gather to pray and in our classrooms. When the opportunity arises teachers are encouraged to integrate the virtues into all subjects so to focus on implementing our gospel values. Moving forward a goal will be to further share Gospel readings with formal lessons on the Virtues to classrooms. Monthly liturgies at Our Lady of the Airways Church strengthen our understanding of the Virtues and their importance in our daily lives. In our morning announcements regularly we include a description of individual expectations and how we can strive to achieve the expectations.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

The Holy Cross community of students, parents, teachers, support staff and administrators will answer to our foundation call of our Baptism. Through our actions and our words we will answer to the call of acting justly, to love tenderly, to walk humbly, to serve generously and to live peacefully. In developing a renewed appreciation of hope in the Church, we accept our spiritual gifts. We promote unity within our school community by gathering together in a variety of contexts by sharing common prayers.

*Prayer is experienced daily as a whole school community, as a class and as an individual. Readings are shared with the whole school. Classroom prayer is also part of the dismissal times for lunch and end of day.

*Symbols of our Faith- In collaboration with the Knights of Columbus from Our Lady of the Airways Parish we have had the opportunity to purchase updated religious statues and virtue plaques. These outward symbols of our Catholic faith beautifies the school and promotes an identity of collective belief to the Holy Cross Community.

*Rosary Apostolate – Once a month group of volunteers from the church come to pray Rosary with all classes and provide reflective opportunities about the Rosary. The student Rosary Club also prays weekly in our Sacred Space. *The Holy Cross Youth Faith Ambassadors work together to help the students of

- the school understand the gospel stories. The Youth Faith Ambassadors, Boy's and Girl's club organize and coordinate the Food Drives for the St. Vincent de Paul Society.
- *The Holy Cross School Choir is made up of students from Grades 3 -8. The students gather together to practice holy music and sign at every mass celebrated at Our Lady of the Airways Church.
- *The Adult Faith Ambassadors help to enrich the spiritual lives of the adults in our school community. They help to organize Family of School Events, namely the Advent Liturgies, and morning prayer opportunities for staff.

*The Holy Cross Sacred Space is a quiet space for students and staff to reflect and pray. The Sacred Space is also used for class/grade liturgies, YFA liturgies and prayer for the Rosary Club. The space is also utilized by our student Divine Chaplet of Mercy club where students meet weekly to recite the prayer of St. Faustina.
